Partner Agency	Description
American Red Cross	An emergency social services and community health education organization that provides disaster relief, assistance to military families and veterans, & transportation services for elderly & disabled
Bay Area Homeless Services	Assists homeless persons with emergency shelter & transitional shelter services. Also provides employment assistance services.
Bay Area Rehabilitation Center	Provides pediatric and adult outpatient therapy and aquatics exercise programs, day habilitation, vocational training, high school transition services, and home and community based services to individuals with disabilities
Bay Area Turning Point	Provides confidential services for victims of domestic violence & sexual assault to include partner violence, rape, sexual abuse, human trafficking, child abuse, incest, & elder abuse. Services provided include assistance in obtaining a protective order, navigating & accessing rights through the criminal justice system, individual counseling, support groups, & temporary shelter.
Baytown Family YMCA	Provides after school care at school sites in GCCISD, summer day camp programs, youth sports and water safety classes, and baseball leagues for special needs children and adults
Baytown Habitat for Humanity	Brings people together to build homes, communities, and hope. Builds affordable homes for families in need.
Baytown Meals on Wheels	Supplies hot, home-delivered meals at lunchtime for seniors 60 years of age or older who qualify under the Texas State Assessment Program.
Baytown Resource & Assistance Center	Provides emergency financial assistance such as food, rent, and utilities to families in need.
Big Brothers Big Sisters Lone Star	Makes meaningful, positive, monitored matches between adult volunteers (Bigs) and children (Littles) ages 7-14 that have a direct and lasting effect on the lives of the kids.
Bridgehaven Children's Advocacy Center	Provides hope and care to the children of Liberty and Chambers counties who are victims of physical, sexual, and emotional abuse and fosters a working relationship with the government agencies of the two counties assigned to protect and defend victims.
Care Partners	Provides support, education, resources and respite to family caregivers and quality no-cost care to those individuals living with memory loss, Alzheimer's or Dementia and other challenges of aging.
CASA of Chambers/Liberty County	Recruits, trains, & supports court-appointed volunteers who advocate for the best interest of every abused/neglected child/teen in the foster care system. Services include Fostering Futures Program, which equips teens with life skills, and the Collaborative Family Engagement program, which finds family connections. CASA is a "Chance for the Child".
Church Women United Child Care Center	Provides affordable care and high quality early education for children 6 weeks - 5 years for low-income families.

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Collaborative for Children	Improves the quality of early childhood education by working with child care centers in Baytown & Mont Belvieu.
Communities In Schools of Baytown	Connects community resources with GCCISD schools to help students learn, stay in school, & successfully prepare for life.
DePelchin Children's Center	Delivers counseling services for children and their families through school-based programs. Also provides foster care, post-adoption counseling, & parent education programs.
Girl Scouts of San Jacinto Council	Builds girls of courage, confidence, and character, who make the world a better place
Houston Volunteer Lawyers	Offers free legal services to low-income families & individuals. Refers qualified applicants to licensed attorneys who volunteer their time.
Love Network of Baytown	Multiple-needs service organization that assists with basic needs such as food, clothing, medical, gasoline, and documentation such as birth certificates & IDs. Also, some work-related assistance provided after job verification.
Our Promise for West Baytown	Serving Baytown's youth & families with an after school study club for elementary grades, art, music, exercise & continued education for youth & adults
Project Grad	Improves lives in low-income communities by helping individuals develop and achieve their educational aspirations.
Sam Houston Area Council Boy Scouts of America	Leads co-ed youth to lifelong values, service, and achievement by providing educational and training programs, which develop character, citizenship, and personal fitness.
Talent Yield Coalition / Marcellous Williams	Provides structured outreach programs and resources for at-risk youth, veterans, homeless, and seniors. Also provides education and certification assistance, along with unemployment services.
The Bridge Over Troubled Waters	Provides services to women, children, & men who are impacted by domestic & sexual violence. Services include hotline assistance, case management & individual counseling, legal advocacy & accompaniment, child advocacy support groups & shelter.
