# QUARTER 2 REPORT

## UNITED WAY PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES

### CLOTHING FOR KIDS CLOSETS

**176 students** were supported with clothing and hygiene essentials, responding quickly to a high level of **urgent need**. Most requests came from GCCISD, with each child receiving an average of **19 items**.

### LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES

Our **22 active Little Free Libraries** continued to spark a love of reading across the community, with **more than 1,000 books** shared. Thanks to generous donors, **1,400 books** were contributed to keep shelves stocked.

### ELEVATING ALICE

**107 unique students** participated in Adulting 101, with quiz results showing a **39% increase** in understanding of financial topics. Students will continue building skills in taxes, banking, and consumer skills before taking part in Reality Check this March.

### EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE

**3,228 families**, an estimated **10,617 individuals**, were supported through **\$42,342** in grants and in-kind support distributed to funded partners and local food pantries during the halt of SNAP benefits.
